KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE PROGRAM WITH APPALACHIAN STATE UNIVERSITY, USA

The eleventh annual The School of Management at Kristu Jayanti College, utonomous, organised the 5th edition of the Knowledge Exchange Program Appalachian collaboration with State University, North Carolina, USA. The 13-day academic program was facilitated by the Office of International and Domestic Relations.

The Knowledge Exchange Programme had 19 graduate and undergraduate students along with 5 faculty members from Appalachian State University participating. They were joined by 15 students and faculty from Kristu Jayanti College, Autonomous.
